### Key Points

Lings Primary School had 208 pupils on roll in the May 2015 school census and 29 pupils eligible for the end of KS2 assessments. 14 percent of these pupils were classed as non-mobile so had been there throughout the duration of the key stage.

The gender split is M/F 48/52, with 62 percent of the key stage 2 cohort eligible for the pupil premium and 31 percent with a statement or school action plus SEN.

Results at achieving L4+ in reading, writing and maths 2015 are above the Northants average and above the national average.

Results at making 2 or more levels progress in reading 2015 are above the Northants average and above the national average.

Results at making 2 or more levels progress in writing 2015 are above the Northants average and above the national average.

Results at making 2 or more levels progress in maths 2015 are above the Northants average and above the national average.

The table to the left shows the schools' rank for each indicator for the various groups of pupils, compared to the rest of the schools in the county. The colours highlight areas where the school is ranked better or worse, e.g. the brighter the red, the closer it is to the bottom of the ranks and the brighter the green, the higher up the ranks it is.

The final column has the range of the ranks, e.g. the pupil premium ranks schools between 1 and 122 as many schools have too small numbers eligible to make comparisons.
